



ANNUAL REPORT 2023 & 2024

Change is upon us.

2023 was a “hard” year if we had to summarize them in one word. The change we had started to see in 2022 came in “fast and furious”, seeing the decline in horses being adopted, and increased expenses due to hay shortages as well as the economy.

The need for many senior horses and complicated medical cases needing surrendering also increased. No one could have predicted for such a hard and fast change, to an industry that was “going strong” just before COVID.

Our gaming grant was received in late 2023, however with the increase in expenses it led us to seeing it zero balance come spring signaling an even bigger challenge. With spring in view, donations were down leading to some of our volunteers and Board Members stepping up to help cover the cost to run Circle F.



Carrying Forward Change

In 2023 we also saw a big project completed- the addition of Auto-Waterers in our Paddocks. With water shortages each summer and many fixes of the well on property, it was highly recommended by our Landlords that we move away from water troughs and to auto-waters to help salvage what water we could.

With many thanks to our Donor for donating two auto-waters, trenching began in spring of 2023 and the project although with great difficulty due to the amount of trenching and moving the herd temporarily was completed before the summers heat. In Spring 2024 trenching began again in our paddocks, as our Landlords installed solar panels to part of the barn. The Solar panels was a project of our Landlords, which involved moving the herd again due to the location of the hydro panel. It was a big project which was completed mid-Summer, and for Circle F saw a reduction in the cost of hydro.


As with 2023, Circle F the depletion of funds late spring in 2024. This was not due to just normal expenses, we as a Team chose to have Diesel scoped to further diagnose his anxiety and failed adoption. Diesel was diagnosed with grade 3 Ulcers, and prescribed Ulcer medication. Though it was an expensive cost, we saw a new horse start to shine bright over the summer and though short lived, Diesel was diagnosed with DSLD-Degenerative Suspensory Ligament Disease in late fall. With all of this we started Diesel on Previcox to help with any pain, and to this day we still see that sweet, less anxious boy that he has come to be.

In the fall we also said see you later to both Board Members Janice and Ronda, which also signaled more change on the Board. With their resignation the current Board took time to review all things Circle F, and begin to prepare for 2025 which we hope to be a better year!




